The AAFES Retired Employees Association (AREA) Scholarship Program is funded through donations by generous benefactors. Each year, AREA awards \$40,000 in scholarships to graduating seniors attending school in the fall. Scholarships are awarded based on the applicant's scholastic honors and other recognition, school and outside activities, hobbies and special talents, letters of recommendation and an essay. This was the first year we offered scholarships to Technical schools, Trade schools and Community Colleges, but did not receive any qualified applications. Of the 30 University applications reviewed, two \$5000 and ten \$3000 scholarships were awarded.
