





12 Children of Exchange Associates Earn AREA Scholarships Totaling \$40,000

The AAFES Retired Employees Association (AREA) Scholarship Program is funded through donations by generous benefactors. Each year, AREA awards \$40,000 in scholarships to graduating seniors attending school in the fall. Scholarships are awarded based on the applicant's scholastic honors and other recognition, school and outside activities, hobbies and special talents, letters of recommendation and an essay. Of the 33 applications reviewed, two \$5,000 and ten \$3,000 scholarships were awarded. Since the scholarship program began in 1985, AREA has awarded \$907,795 to 395 students.



Marcus Metsala, son of Dan Metsala, retired senior vice president, is awarded the top \$5,000 scholarship. Marcus has been accepted at several schools, including the University of Texas at Austin and Baylor, and is seeking a biomedical engineering degree. While attending Mansfield High School, he was ranked in the top 2% of his class. Marcus is a member of the National Honor Society and Vice President of the Key Club. He was instrumental in providing free online tutoring for students during the pandemic. His goal is to become a physician.



Jillian Moore, the daughter of Jason Moore, HQ Telecom chief, is also awarded a \$5,000 scholarship. Jillian will attend the University of Texas at Austin studying neuroscience. Jillian is a member of the National Honor Society, an Advanced Placement Scholar, a staff writer on the school paper and a varsity wrestler at Coppell High School. She volunteered with Meals on Wheels and several community garden projects, and studies American Sign Language. Jillian plans to research the effects of drugs on human behavior and find solutions.


